Types of Working Visas in Cape Verde

Like any other country, Cape Verde has specific procedures in place that foreign nationals must follow if they plan to visit. Citizens of several countries, including the United States, can travel to the country as tourists and stay for up to 30 days without a visa. Visa categories for longer stays include:

- **Tourist visas:** This type of visa allows the holder to stay in Cape Verde for up to 90 days with the possibility of one extension.
- **Official, diplomatic, and courtesy visas:** These visas allow multiple entries and a stay of

up to 30 days.

- Transit visas: These visas allow foreign nationals to travel through Cape Verde on the way to a destination in another country. A transit visa is valid for four days and is eligible for one extension.
- Temporary visas: This type of visa applies to foreign nationals who plan to travel to Cape Verde one out of a number of possible reasons, including cultural travel, short-term professional activity, and other purposes as decided by immigration authorities. Single- and multiple-entry visas are available.

Cape Verde also offers a residence visa for foreigners in certain circumstances, such as those who plan to work for a local business.

What Are the Requirements to Obtain a Cape Verde Work Visa?

In order to get a residence and work visa in Cabo Verde, foreign nationals will need to submit:

- A valid passport with at least one blank page for the entry stamp
- A recent passport photo
- A completed application form
- An employment contract with a company based in Cape Verde
- Proof of accommodations in Cape Verde
- Payment of the visa fee

Visa requirements can vary from one embassy to another, so applicants should reach out to the nearest diplomatic mission for a comprehensive and up-to-date list. Additional requirements might include a statement of intent to leave Cape Verde after the work contract ends or proof of the applicant's ability to pay all costs related to the trip.

What Is the Application Process Like for a Cape Verde Work Visa?

To begin the visa application process, foreign employees should locate the nearest embassy or consulate of Cape Verde to confirm the list of required documents. They should then gather the necessary materials and complete the application.

Applicants can apply for a visa by mail or by visiting the embassy in person. After applying, the employee should wait for visa approval in their country of residence. Once the relevant officials approve the visa, the employee can travel to Cape Verde to begin working.

Other Important Considerations

In many cases, visas in Cabo Verde are eligible for renewal if necessary. Employees should begin the renewal process before their visa expires so as to remain in the country without any issues.
