How to Set up a Central African Republic Subsidiary

If you're ready to set up a Central African Republic subsidiary, you need to examine two important factors — your location and your business activities. For example, different states in the US can have regulations that differ from national or federal guidelines. The same applies to the Central African Republic, where different regions or cities could have their own incorporation laws. If you're not familiar with the different Central African Republic subsidiary laws by region, you should work with an expert who can help you find the best place.

The next thing you need to consider is your type of entity. Your incorporation options include a limited liability company (LLC), public limited company, branch, or representative office. The structures differ in the types of activities they allow and the laws that apply. For example, LLCs have the most operating freedom, but they face many laws related to financial statements and annual filing. Branches and representative offices are more restrictive, but they have fewer laws.

Many companies decide to incorporate as an LLC. If you do the same, you'll need to:

- Deposit your legally required initial capital in a bank account or at the notary
- Have two bank directors sign deposit evidence
- File certain documents for notarization, including the company's contract, criminal record certificate, sworn declaration, and director's residence certificate
- Register the company at the commercial registry
- Complete a sworn declaration at the Guichet Unique de formalités des Entreprises (GUFÉ)
- Send a copy of the criminal record to the National Court
- Obtain a tax identification number
- Register for social security
- Advertise the company's formation in a national news daily
- Register with the Chamber of Commerce

- Notify the proper authorities when you hire employees and file a declaration at the Regional Directorate of Employment
- Obtain a business license at the Municipality for XAF

Central African Republic Subsidiary Laws

Following the correct Central African Republic subsidiary laws for your entity will help you stay compliant and avoid fines and fees. LLCs require at least one director and one shareholder who can be an individual or a legal entity. Both can live anywhere and be of any nationality. The minimum paid-up share capital to complete the incorporation process is \$1,800, but you'll need to pay other fees throughout the steps listed above.

If your company's share capital is above \$18,000, your annual turnover exceeds \$45,000, or you employ more than 50 employees, you'll need to appoint a statutory auditor. Doing so will ensure that your financial statements and tax filings are correct throughout the year.
